

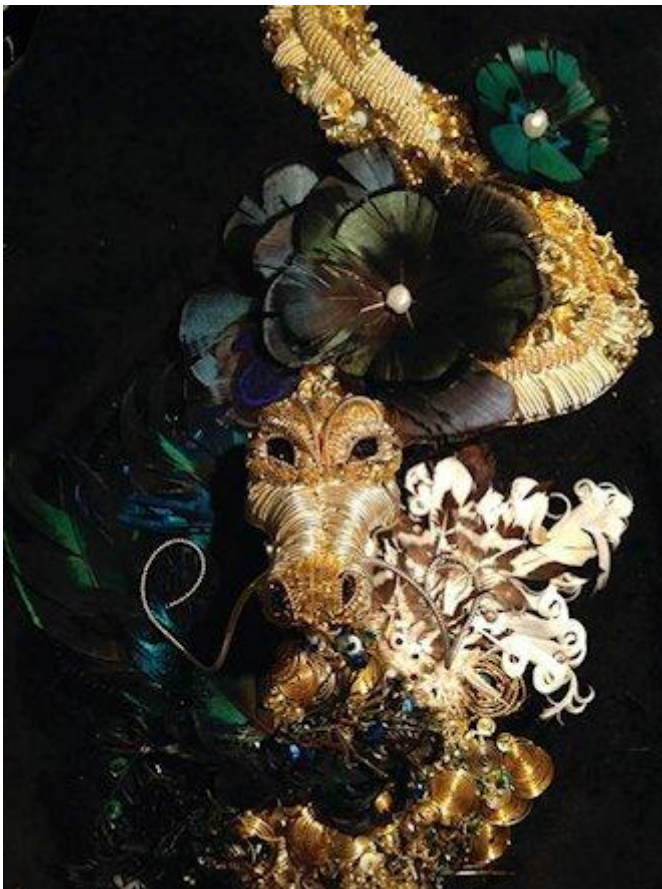
Each year the Embroiderers' Guild selects three Embroiderers' Guild Scholars and awards each of them £1000 to enable them to pursue an original project that will further their artistic practice.

The Scholarships are for embroiderers who have studied the practice of embroidery or stitched textiles through a formal or informal programme of learning. Each Scholar will be awarded £1000 to support them in projects which will further their own practice. During the Scholarship year, Scholars will be involved in Guild activities and exhibitions.

Three Scholars will be selected for 2018/19 one post grad under 30 years of age, one post grad over 30 years and one post grad Education Scholarship will be awarded to an embroiderer with significant experience within the education sector; the application deadline for all three Scholarships is March 5th 2018.

EMBROIDERERS' GUILD SCHOLARSHIPS



Three Embroiderers' Guild Scholarships of £1000 each are awarded annually to students to develop and further the practice of embroidery.

The three categories are as follows:

- Post Graduate - up to 30 years of age Scholarship
- Post Graduate - over 30 Scholarship
- Post Graduate Education Scholarship (significant experience within the education sector required)



All

applicants should have studied the practice of embroidery or stitched textiles through formal or informal learning. In addition, applicants for the Education Scholarship should have significant experience within the education sector.



The Scholarships are to support students and tutors to undertake projects which further their own practice. Working with the Embroiderers' Guild during the Scholarship year will provide each Scholar with opportunities to be introduced to the Guild's network of members, branches and practising professionals. Plus the Education Scholar must be prepared, in association with the Embroiderers' Guild, to take an active role in the promotion of embroidery in schools.
