'Millefiori Inspired Brooch using Metal Threads'

A two day course 31 May – 2 June 2019



Jenny is a freelance professional hand embroiderer/designer; working to commission and inspiring others through enthusiastic teaching. She trained on the RSN Intensive Apprenticeship graduating in 1999 and continuing to work at RSN for a further 10 years



Based on the jewel like colours and intricate patterns of Italian cut cane millefiori glass you will use a variety of metal thread/goldwork embroidery designs to create a beautiful brooch. We will explore the range of types, textures and colours of metal threads now available and you will learn to use these confidently to create a wearable design. You can buy a kit for this workshop, prices from £17.50. Suitable for all levels of ability.

'Gustav Klimt reworked in stitch and textiles'

A two day course 31may – 2 June 2019

After working as a pattern cutter in the 80s and then teaching fashion subjects (FE/HE), I completed a degree in Fine Art in 1993. This inevitably led to a change in direction for my textiles practice – developing experiment photographic print techniques as well as developing ideas for stitch and print using synthetic polymers and utilising desktop technologies (PCs & Printers!!!), or looking at it another way, blending the old with the new. If you are keen to see this work, I have published Spunbonded Textile & Stitch by Batsford (2011) and Inkjet Printing on Fabric by Bloomsbury (2014) I am currently completing an MA in Textiles Practice (Jan 2019), and then onwards with new ideas.





Gustav Klimt's work continues to provide endless scope for the imagination and to rework those ideas in stitch and print.

This workshop will examine some of these pieces and develop a resource of techniques using velvet as base fabric, metallic stitch (both hand and machine) and simple printing techniques in conjunction with metallic printing inks.

Students may jump off at any point to develop an idea and work independently. The techniques explored in this workshop will be the starting point for creating a resource of worked samples for future use.
