To take part in this Guild project...

- Create an original piece of embroidery on a piece of white or sky blue fabric.
- Stretch your embroidery over a piece of stiff card using the lacing method.
- Print and complete the entry form, including a paragraph describing the reason for your design and the methods used.

DESCRIPTION: The story behind your design and a note of the materials and techniques used:

IMPORTANT: Before placing your piece in an envelope it must be treated with an anti-bacterial spray immediately before it is posted to reduce the risk of the virus being transmitted on the piece and still be there when the envelope is opened.
